April 2025

- Seminars will take place this month in DR Congo, India and Liberia. Pray that the participants who will attend will grow in their preaching skills and love of God's Word.
- A new preaching movement begins in Laos this month, an exciting development through the connection of the preaching movements in Thailand. Pray for those who will be starting their training for the first time and the facilitators who will be walking alongside them.
- Pray for the SST (Society for the Study of Theology) Annual Conference at the University of Warwick, UK and for Luke Lewis and Hanna Palliser who are attending the conference, sharing about our recent publications in theology.
- Pray for publisher, author, preacher and seminary principal Slava V in Belarus as he juggles all these responsibilities in a country increasingly isolated from outside support. From April this year it will become impossible to transfer funds through the bank. He is currently writing another book with Langham support and rushing to get it finished in time.
- Please pray for Joseph Byamukama's graduation in Melbourne, as well as the number of events he will be attending in Australia (organised by Langham Australia), while he is in the country.
- The Selection Committee will meet again for a second time to decide the new scholar finalists. Please pray for those involved as they make their decisions.
- Please pray for the Scholars who are close to completing their PhDs, that the Lord will give them the dedication, time and resources to complete.
- Pray for all involved in the Langham US Vision weekend taking place this month.

May 2025

- This month sees the annual gathering of our Langham Preaching Global Leadership Team in Izmir, Turkey. After our time together, we will meet with senior leaders of the Literature and Scholars programme. Please pray for a time when relationships are deepened and our working together increases.
- Pray for our Preaching Movement Coordinators around the world who look after our 117 preaching movements in 100 countries. They are working alongside their national committees to lead the work in seven key areas - leadership, finance, preaching clubs, facilitators, diversity, impact and resources.
- Please pray for French Editorial Coordinator Claire Moore, as she attends an event in Paris - La Place at the Centre évangélique, sharing our latest releases with the Francophone community.
- Please pray for the success of the Association of Evangelicals in Africa general assembly in Rwanda where Langham will be officially announcing the release of the Africa Bible Commentary Revision later in 2025.
- Literature Director Hani Hanna will be traveling to the UK for leadership meetings. Please pray for safe travel and good meetings.
- Please pray for the conference 'The Mission of the Ukrainian Churches in the European Diaspora' for theological educators who left Ukraine because of the war and are now engaged in theological education in the European diaspora (14-15 May, Warsaw, Poland). Regional Commissioning Editor Roman Soloviy will participate in the conference and present the Ukrainian translation of the global compendium of diaspora missiology (Scattered and Gathered).
- Paul Barker would like prayer as the Melbourne Diocese will elect a new Archbishop.
- Please pray for the meeting from 1–8 May in Turkey, bringing together the three programmes within Langham Partnership. This will be a mixture of individual, small group, and all-group meetings with a focus on collaboration between the programmes.
- Please pray for the applicants who will receive news that they have not been successful this year in being offered a scholarship. Pray also for those who will receive the good news that they are being offered a scholarship and that they manage to get their contracts and paperwork all in order to be fully accepted as a new Langham Scholar.
- Please pray for our Leadership Team and International Council meeting this month.

June 2025

- The Asia and South Pacific Continental Leadership Team will meet in Sydney, Australia this month. Please pray that this large and diverse team which represent so many different cultures and languages will be able to set strategies for their work together in the months ahead.
- Our Global Forum takes place this month in Tirana, Albania. This year our focus will be looking at the topic of locally raised support and enabling our movements to become self-sustaining. 32 participants from around the world will attend and we will learn from those movements who already raise their own support as well as set a strategy for the wider work in this key area.

- The 2024 / 2025 Library Grant season will conclude this month. Give thanks for the many books that have been sent to colleges throughout the majority world. Pray that they will be a source of inspiration and a deepening knowledge for all who use them.

- Please pray for partnership visits in Northern Ireland and England and Hani Hanna's presence at the meetings.
- Please pray for applicants who will receive a Langham Scholarship, starting in July 2025 and also for the many applicants who will be disappointed not to be amongst this group this year. Especially pray for new Langham Scholars who will be making a move to a different country to start their PhD study programme in the next few months.

Give thanks that outcomes so far have exceeded expectations. Pray for Tekalign as he learns so many new skills and faces so many hurdles.
- Please pray for the Langham Writers' forum in Indonesia for the project "Salvation in Indonesian Context".
- Please pray for our new Langham Graduates (i.e., those who have received their doctorates in the last 12 months). Especially remember those who will be transitioning back to their home country in the next few months and maybe picking up new responsibilities with their sending institutions.
- We give thanks for the work that Mardochee Nadoumngar has done for several years now as Scholar Care Coordinator for Francophone Africa. As he steps down from this role at the end of June and another person takes on these responsibilities, we pray for a smooth handover process and good integration into our scattered team.
- Indonesia Forum at the beginning of July 2025. Please pray for the time spent as a group together.
- Pray for Rev Dr Chris Wright as he speaks at the Keswick Portstewart and Keswick Cumbria conventions this month.

August 2025

- Pray for our Continental Directors who oversee the staff teams in Latin America, Europe, the Caribbean, Africa, Asia and the South Pacific. Pray for wisdom and strength as they lead disparate teams around the world from diverse backgrounds and cultures.
- Pray for our administrators around the world who work hard behind the scenes assisting in the smooth operational running of Langham Preaching. They are based in Bolivia, Ghana, UK, Indonesia, India and Egypt.

- Please pray for the scholars and their family whose countries are suffering, though war, political conflict, persecution and poverty. Pray for their safety and their communities.
- Please pray for the Scholars' team and all the hard work and dedication they provide.

September 2025

- This month sees Level 1 and Level 3 training taking place in Cairo. Please pray for those participants who are just beginning their training and those who are coming to the end of the process. Pray that new facilitators will be raised up to continue the training and its reach into new parts of the city.
- The need for resources in key areas of our work continues, for example resources for preaching clubs and facilitators as well as participants. Pray for Esteban Amestegui (Bolivia) as he looks at how to develop non-print resources.
- Please pray for indigenous evangelical publishers. Pray for discernment in understanding local needs, wisdom in appropriate title selection, and professionalism in production.
- Please pray for preparations being made now for several Consultations to be held around the world in 2026. These events enable Scholars to come together for mutual encouragement and support, giving them an opportunity to present from their research as well as to enjoy times of fellowship together.
